# **Reading at Springfield**

Grammar and word classification are a vital part of the curriculum from Reception right up to Year 6 here at Springfield. It is important that your child is able to classify words by their word class. Attached is a glossary of the six main word classes that children need to know.

## Maths at Springfield - Key Stage 1

The fundamental point of numeracy is that children (and the adults they'll grow to be) can use it in their everyday life. Giving them real-life opportunities to practise their addition skills also makes them feel grown up and boosts their self-esteem. So at the supermarket get them to put, for example, five oranges and four apples in your basket and ask them how many pieces of fruit you'll be buying. Similarly learning money basics when you're out and about can be a great incentive for getting their number brain working.

Roblox is an online gaming and entertainment platform for a shared digital experience that brings people together through play. It enables anyone to imagine, create, and have fun with friends as they explore interactive 3D experiences produced by developers. Within using this platform, children are exposed to learning computing skills such as coding, programming and enhancing their ability to browse the internet. Whilst there are always positives to online gaming platforms, they do come with posed risks. Games within Roblox can contain age inappropriate themes for children aged 7 or over, with some games allowing horror, murder or bloody themes. The best solution to monitor your child's activity is to be involved in their usage, with an open communication with how you can restrict their viewing.



Here are some tips on how to secure their account:

- Specify the Account Restrictions setting in the linked Roblox account. This limits the playable games to those selected by Roblox itself. Although do note that setting a child's age as under 13 doesn't limit the games they can access.
- Enter the correct date of birth for your child's account. This will trigger the appropriate safe-chat with a higher level of filtering.
- Log in to roblox.com, click the Gear icon in the top right, select Settings then Privacy, then restrict interactions via Content Settings and Other Settings




