Reading at Springfield

This summer we are launching the Springfield Summer Reading Challenge. The challenge is to read six books over the summer holidays (roughly one book per week). Those that complete the challenge will receive a certificate and a Mufti Day on Friday 10th September. Your child will be bringing the Springfield Summer Reading Challenge sheet home with them, but we have also attached one in case it is lost. Please encourage your child to complete the challenge and then sign their challenge sheet once complete. This challenge is a great way to ensure that children retain and develop their reading skills over the long summer break.





Maths at Springfield - Key Stage 1

Numicon is a teaching resource designed to help children when they are beginning to recognise numbers and number relationships (at-home sets are available for around £40).

Each Numicon is a different shape and colour and represents a different number up to 10. Because it is multi-sensory, it helps children develop a visual image of what a number 'looks' like. They can develop their understanding of the relationships between numbers, for example by finding all the different combinations of Numicon which make 10. Older children can use Numicon to help understand decimal numbers, or to reinforce ideas they might find tricky.





Earlier this year we were delighted to be awarded Gold Status by the Anti-bullying Alliance to reflect our commitment to making Springfield a caring and welcoming environment for all children. As part of the review conducted under the accreditation, it was recommended that we work with the children to develop a "child-friendly" anti-bullying policy. This document, which is based on and contains the key elements of the school's formal Anti-bullying policy, will be shared with all children and their families to ensure that everyone knows and understands how best to support our pupils and how any worries or concerns can be reported.

This document is now available on our school website and you can view it here. In September, all children will be introduced to the policy in a special assembly, and posters and copies of the policy will be available in all classrooms and in key points around the school.

Geographer of the Year Event

E-Safety

Keeping your children safe over the summer holiday.

As we move towards the 6 week summer break, as a school we thought we would share some useful resources that will provide advice and reassurance on how to keep your children safe online during the summer. As we know, the internet is an incredibly useful and exciting tool to socialise with friends, communicate with family, whilst benefiting children's mental health and wellbeing. When children spend more time online, they may, however, be exposed to greater online risks. Your child needs reminding that they cannot trust everyone they meet online. Let them know that they should be careful and let you know if they feel uncomfortable, worried or frightened about any online activity during the summer.

If during the summer break, you are concerned with anything you may see or hear on a child's device, you can report the issue to CEOP (Child Exploitation and Online Protection) for immediate response https://www.ceop.police.uk/Ceop-Report/ or call 101 and ask for the Child Online Safeguarding Team, as they may be at risk.
