

Springfield Eco Representatives

The eco representatives have been busy completing an environmental review as part of their first project this term. Completing the review is a process of examining Springfield school's environmental impacts in order to identify targets for actions across the school year.

The children looked at many things around the school, some of these included, checking lights were off in unused areas, seeing whether computers were in energy saving mode when not in use and whether there was an up-to-date eco board that could communicate the current projects the eco team were undertaking around the school. The team were pleased with the results of the audit, however had many ideas as to how the school could lessen its environmental impact through projects that could be run throughout the year.

The next step is to create their action plan based upon this and launch their first project for the Autumn term 'Switch off Fortnight'. The representatives look forward to making some great changes to make our school a more eco-friendly place.

This week we look at the responsibilities of the School Standards Board (SSB) in relation to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children.

The SSB has a strategic leadership responsibility for the school's safeguarding arrangements and must ensure that the school complies with its duties under legislation.

The SSB ensures that policies, procedures and training in school are effective and comply with the law at all times. This includes the safeguarding and child protection policy, which describes procedures in accordance with government guidance and can be found on the school website in the policies section. The SSB has appointed its Vice-Chair Philippa Studd, as Safeguarding lead to monitor the effectiveness of this policy in conjunction with the full SSB.

All members of the SSB have undertaken safeguarding training so that we all possess the knowledge and information needed to perform our roles effectively, understand our responsibilities and assure ourselves that the school's safeguarding arrangements are robust.
