Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you all enjoyed a good break over the Easter period.

Children have returned **refreshed and ready to learn** and this has been in evidence this week, with pupils in **Year 2 planting the beans from their science experiments** in the **allotment, Year 6 drafting some impressive creative writing diaries** and **children in the Nursery demonstrating excellent learning in phonics.**

Pupils in Year 5 and 6 competed in the dodgeball county finals on Thursday and in this we are incredibly proud of their achievements, securing the overall winning position. This now takes the team to the Nationals in June; well-done to all for this exceptional sporting achievement!



On Tuesday, it was **primary school offer day**. In this I am pleased to let families know that we **exceeded applications numbers for the fourth year running, including the highest level of first preferences.** Now, as the summer term begins, induction events commence, we welcome our new families to the school community.

Just before the Easter break, the government released the White Paper, *Opportunity for All: Strong Schools with Great Teachers for your Child*. Within this there was a strong emphasis on the **critical role 100% attendance in school plays in pupils' well-being and learning.** Please could I ask for your support in **refraining from taking children out of school for events and/holidays**. In going forward the DfE have removed the school's coding for Covid-19 as a separate absence category and so all Covid-related illness will be recorded as general sickness. Against the back-drop of the pandemic, we are still working hard to ensure **lost learning is addressed and this becomes significantly more difficult when pupils are not in school.**

Maths at Springfield

Supporting children with their understanding of shape and space.

You can support your child's learning by helping them to describe shapes in terms of properties, such as:

- the number of sides/edges
- the number of faces
- the number of vertices/corners
- types of angles within shapes
- lines of symmetry (if any)

Encourage them to use specific mathematical language such as diagonal, vertical, horizontal, and parallel too.

Ask your child to draw different types of 2D shapes such as triangles (for example, isosceles, equilateral, and scalene) and quadrilaterals (for example, parallelogram, rhombus, and trapezium). To up the challenge, why not specify dimensions such as length of the sides or size of the angles? Choose a number between 3 and 10 and ask your child to draw as many polygons as they can with a particular number of sides.

Ask your child to describe the polygons they have drawn. What is the same about the shapes? What is different? What are the names of the shapes you have drawn? Is this shape regular or irregular? What do you know about the angles in your shapes?

Children often love learning about shape and space, especially if they get the chance to draw the shapes themselves.



This is the second time we have managed to win the Surrey Schools Competition and therefore reach the National Finals.
