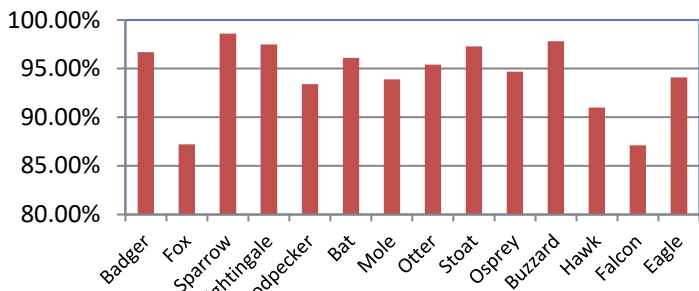
**Inset Day** – A reminder that next week Friday 28<sup>th</sup> June, the school will be an Inset Day and there will be no children in school.
