We have developed our outdoor learning environments, to enable children to learn in different ways.



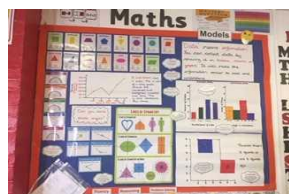
We have created an alternative learning curriculum, The Hive, to enable all children to feel positive and achieve their very best.

...and so much more!

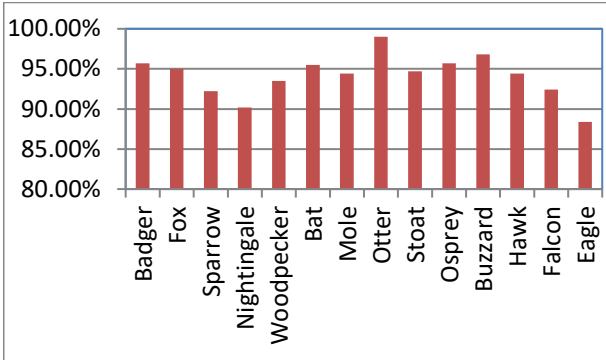
Children, staff and parents have worked so hard this year to make Springfield the very special school it is - a school we are incredibly proud of!
