Dear Parents,

The positive start of last week has continued into this, with Year 2s relishing the opportunity to be part of the Roald Dahl day, whilst Year 6s visited Walton Fire Station as part of the Junior Citizen Programme. Pupils across every year group have enthusiastically been working very hard completing home-learning, with some very impressive pick and mix projects; well done children!

Next week our Harvest Assembly takes place, with St Saviours in attendance. As part of this, please could all food donations be brought into the main office by Wednesday. All donations will be very gratefully received, supporting our local food bank.

This year we want to develop further community links and as part of this we have developed a partnership with the local charity Baraka. This is a small charity for whom work with schools in Zambia and Laos, helping to build schools, provide resources and sponsor children whilst studying. Through this partnership we have developed a link with Kato School in Zambia. Over the summer we have donated reading books and are looking forward to welcoming a pupil from Kato to meet our children in October. Whilst continuing to support a range of charities, some of our fundraising will support Baraka.







Last year, as admissions closed, we had a record 85% of parents selecting Springfield as their first preference of primary school. This year we want to continue this success, with our next open morning next Friday, 20th September at 9.30-10.30am. 
