Dear Parents,

The focus for our assemblies over the next two weeks has been Keeping Ourselves Safe. This week we focus on anti-bullying and next week we will talking to children in KS2 about online safety. Attached to this newsletter is guidance for parents and schools from the NSPCC regarding how to help children be safe whilst using the internet. To support this the school is running a workshop for parents about keeping children safe online on 7th October, 3.30-4.30pm. For parents wishing to attend, the leadership team will be on hand to provide childcare, to help facilitate this for all.

Well-done to pupils in Year 5 for some exceptionally imaginative Egyptian stories, to those in Year 6 for their letter writing and for children in Nursery in making a very positive transition; we are incredibly proud of you all!

Reading at Springfield

In Springfield Primary School, we use books to support the children with their understanding of the Cornerstones Curriculum topics and English units in which we study. In EYFS and KS1, the children use a wide variety of texts to support this. In KS2 this term the children are focusing on the following books:

Year 3: The Iron Man – Mighty Metals

Year 4: Harry Potter, the Philosopher's Stone - Potions

Year 5: The Red Pyramid (The Kane Chronicles) – Pharaohs

Year 6: Goodnight Mr Tom – A Child's War



Please ask your child about the above books and see what facts they can recall about each one. Being able to explain key parts of the story demonstrates knowledge and understanding of the texts that have been read.
