# A note from the Headteacher

Dear Parents,

Pupils in Year 4 have had a magical week, visiting Harry Potter World, as part of their Potions topic for this half-term. Year 3 have produced some exceptional writing about the Iron Man and girls in Years 4-5 played brilliantly against Buckland Primary School.

On Monday after school, Mrs Wilson and Mr Gough led a workshop for parents about keeping children safe whilst online. The presentation is on the website, under the Safeguarding tab. Information shared was informed through a number of safeguarding sources, providing the following guidance for parents:

- Keep the computer in a high-traffic area of your home.
- Establish limits for which online sites children may visit and for how long.
- Remember that Internet technology can be mobile, so make sure to monitor mobile phones, gaming devices, and laptops.
- Surf the Internet with your children and let them show you what they like to do online.
- Know who is connecting with your children online and set rules for social networking, instant messaging, e-mailing, online gaming, and using webcams.
- Check the browser search history on a regular basis.



Some tricky challenges also required some very creative thinking. The week culminated with our brave children donning full wet suits and life vests and plunging into the sea to ride the rafts they had built out of barrels and ropes.

After a week of big breakfasts, cooked lunches and dinners, we all came home heavier, and completely exhausted, but also much happier for having conquered some fears and acquired new skills.


