Reading at Springfield

At Springfield Primary School, children begin to develop their inference skills in reading from the end of KS1. These types of questions are typically more challenging and require children to think more carefully about the answer. Inference questions are the types of questions that involve reading between the lines. Students are required to make an educated guess, as the answer will not be stated explicitly. Students must use clues from the text, coupled with their own experiences, to draw a logical conclusion. The teaching of inference skills is extremely important to our students. It is a higher order skill that is essential for students to develop to afford them access to the deepest levels of comprehension. Having a finely tuned ability to infer also has important applications in other subject areas too, particularly math and science.

The following questions can be used to support inference as a comprehension skill with your child at home:

- How did the character feel when ...?
- What lessons did the character learn? Use evidence to justify.
- Find evidence in the text that shows...

Flu Vaccinations – The flu vaccinations will take place on Friday 29th November for Years R to 6. A letter has been emailed to parents this week with the link to complete the consent form online, which includes if you do not wish your child to be vaccinated. Please can these be completed by no later than Thursday 21st November. If these are not completed, your child will not be able to have the flu vaccine in school and you will have to arrange a separate appointment with the immunisation team. The flu vaccination is done annually and consents need to be renewed for each year.










PTA News
