# **Reading at Springfield**

Below are a list of useful tips from the Parent Forum and our school reading team about how we can make reading even more engaging at home and ensure your child is entered into the reading raffle each week:

- Make reading more fun by using silly voices when different characters are speaking.
- Identify a time, for example once per week, where a mystery reader comes and reads to your • child, this could be a member of the family or a family friend.
- As mentioned in the newsletter last week, visit a local library. ٠
- Create a reading zone or area at home where your child can relax and read their book. •
- Have a routine for when their reading diary gets signed, for example during breakfast time.
- In year groups such as Reception, Year 1 and Year 2, it is important to re-read books to build up fluency skills with your child.
- Create a reward chart for your child, if they are a reading star 4 times in a month they can choose an activity you could do as a family.
