Dear Parents,

Welcome back and a Happy New Year!

As part of our well-being, Thrive Programme in school, led by Mrs Standing, this term we are thinking about happiness. In assemblies we will explore:

- What does it mean to be happy?
- How do we know when we are happy?
- What makes us feel happy?
- How does our happiness affect other people?

Within this theme, we will also be thinking about how happiness comes through building relationships and communication with others, which will be the focus for our next Thrive, well-being afternoon on 13th February. We hope this, despite possible January blues, provides some fun, positivity and great discussion.



Reading at Springfield


