General Information

Water Bottles – Please make sure that your child has a water bottle with them in school.

Dates for your Diary – Please find attached the dates for your diary for the autumn term.

School dinners – Please ensure that you have booked your child's meals by no later than lunchtime on Friday of the preceding week. This a reminder that Nursery and Years 3-6 are required to pay for school dinners, unless you are eligible for free school meals. The new cost of the school dinner is £2.40. Children in years R-2 still qualify for the universal free meals and no payment is required.

Clubs/KOOSA Kids — At present, we are unable to run extra-curricular clubs. Should you require wrap-around care, KOOSA Kids will be running the breakfast and after school childcare provision for Years R-6 from Monday 7th September. Please book directly with KOOSA Kids. Please also note their adapted arrangements prior to booking via their website.

Weekly PE Timetable

Pupils will be required to wear full school uniform, with the exception of the <u>one</u> day within the week, set out below, when they will have PE. On this day they will be required to wear their PE kits into school. On all other days, pupils will need to be in full school uniform.
